

MICHAEL DOWD, Esq. is dedicated to confronting and fighting injustice. He has been long-recognized by his peers and the press for his courtroom skills, particularly his zealous courtroom advocacy on behalf of his clients. Mike Dowd is a pioneer in the battered women's movement. Back in the 1980 when the few heard of the problem of domestic violence, Mr. Dowd successfully defended a battered woman who killed her husband. He is the founding director of the Pace University Women's Justice Center and the recipient of awards for his work on behalf of battered women. He successfully defended Irish supporters of Irish Independence from England, successfully handled the trial of a woman using post-partum depression in an insanity defense and then kept the woman out of a psychiatric hospital. He has written articles for the Fordham Urban Law Journal, The Cardozo Woman's Law Journal and the Pace Law Review
