Marc Fernich concentrates his criminal work on complex appeals and motions at the federal and state levels, complemented by an expanding trial practice. Educated at the University of Pennsylvania and Northwestern University School of Law, Fernich has appeared in many high-profile cases during his 20-year career, representing a diverse roster of clients ranging from suspected gangsters to sophisticated businesspeople. Named a 2009-11 New York-Metro Super Lawyer and a preeminent attorney by Martindale-Hubbell, Fernich has created landmark legal precedents across the country, recently briefing and arguing a major racketeering case before the U.S. Supreme Court. A feisty cross-examiner and a prolific author, Fernich frequently writes and lectures about criminal law, publishing widely and serving as an Adjunct Associate Professor at Brooklyn Law School, where he teaches appellate advocacy.
